Look at the Picture

Where is... / Where are... / Is there a... / Are there any...?

There's a computer on the boy's desk. There's a monitor, a keyboard and a mouse in front of the boy. There's a laptop on the girl's desk. He's / She's got (a pair of) headphones on his / her head. There's a tablet on the floor / under the bed. There's a camera between the books on the bookshelf. There's a memory stick / a flash drive behind the laptop. There's a cable that connects the computer to the electricity supply. There's a cable that connects the headphones to the phone. There are three batteries next to the computer. There's no television in the room. There are no CDs / DVDs.

What are they doing?

The boy's sitting at the desk / at the computer. He's using the computer.

He's playing a video game. He's doing his homework. He's using / browsing the internet. He's looking something up on the Internet. She's listening to music through headphones.

How Digital Are You?

With a Partner

Guessing Game

- 1 Student A looks at the picture and chooses one digital device, like a tablet, a camera or a phone. Student A doesn't tell Student B.
- 2 Student B asks three questions that Student A can answer with "yes" or "no" (e.g. *Is it on the desk? / next to the computer? / on the floor?...; Is the boy / girl using it?; Do you use it to call your parents? / to watch films?...*)
- 3 Student A answers the questions.
- 4 Student B guesses what Student A is thinking of.
- 5 Now Student B chooses something in the picture and Student A guesses.
