Practise There is... / There are...

What is there in the picture?

a Christmas tree, star, decorations, bells, presents, icicles, snow, a fireplace, stockings, candles, a wreath, holly, an angel, potatoes, a turkey, cookies, a Christmas cake, a table, chairs, Mum, Dad, Grandpa, a cat, a boy

How many... are there?

stars / decorations / bells / presents / stockings / candles / angels / people / children / chairs...

Practise Present Continuous.

What is happening in the picture?

- The boy is opening the presents.
- The parents are sitting at the table.
- The parents are talking and eating.
- The snow is falling.
- The stockings are hanging above the fireplace.
- The candles are burning.
- The cat is sleeping.

CHRISTMAS GAME: Snowball Fight

Students write three things that they want for Christmas on a piece of paper. They crumple it up and have a class snowball fight. When the teacher says stop, they pick up a piece of paper and go around the class asking questions to find the person who wants those things.

Where is it / are they? What is next to the window?

- a Christmas tree **next to** the window
- presents **under** the Christmas tree
- decorations **on** the Christmas tree
- a star **at the top** of the tree
- icicles **on** the window
- three candles **above** the fireplace
- a cat **in front of** the fireplace

Practise Present Simple.

What usually happens on Christmas Eve / Christmas Day in the Czech Republic / the United Kingdom?

CR: to celebrate Christmas with all the family / to bake Christmas cookies / to decorate a Christmas tree / to hang Christmas decorations / to visit friends / to eat a Christmas meal / to wait for baby Jesus to bring Christmas presents /

- a piece of holly **between** the wreath and the angel
- small presents **in** the stockings
- a Christmas wreath **on** the wall **above** the candles
- a turkey / potatoes / a Christmas cake / Christmas cookies **on** the table
- snow **outside** the window

to open Christmas presents / to sing Christmas carols / to go to church / to watch Christmas fairytales...

UK: to hang a Christmas stocking / to wait for Father Christmas / to open Christmas presents in the morning / to pull Christmas crackers / to have Christmas lunch...

What do you usually do on Christmas Eve / on Christmas Day / on New Year's Eve?
