the countryside, a town, a village, a road, grass, a field, a hill, a river, a lake, the woods / a forest, a mountain, a tree, a stone / rock, the sun, the sky

Look at the Picture

What's in the city?

There is a post office / a cinema / a library / a hospital / a school on the street. There isn't a theatre / a factory / a bookshop on the street. There are some people walking up and down the street / standing in the street / walking / standing on the pavement / in the square. There are no people swimming in the swimming pool. There are some cars driving on the street.

What's in the country?

There is a village on the hill. There is a church / There are some houses / farms in the village. There are some trees / some sheep / some fields near the village. There is a river / a bridge / a road next to the village. There is a forest / a mountain. There isn't a lake / There aren't any statues in the countryside. The sun is in the sky. There are a few clouds in the sky.

I live in a big / small city / a town / a village. There is a school / a cinema / a train station in my city / town / village. There aren't any swimming pools / factories / libraries there. There are some fields / There is a lake / a mountain near it. There aren't any trees / There isn't a forest / a river near it. There are a lot of people there. Not many people live there.

With a Partner

Guessing Game

- 1 Student A looks at the picture and chooses one thing, like a person, a building, the river or a tree. Student A doesn't tell Student B.
- 2 Student B asks questions that Student A can answer with "yes" or "no".
- 3 Student A answers the questions.
- 4 Student B guesses what Student A is thinking of.

Example:

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|-----------|-----------------------|-----------|--------------------|
| B: | Is it a person? | A: | No, it isn't. |
| A: | No, it isn't. | B: | Is it blue? |
| B: | Is it in the country? | A: | Yes, it is. |
| A: | Yes, it is. | B: | Is it the river? |
| B: | Is it in the village? | A: | Yes, that's right! |
- 5 Now Student B chooses something in the picture and Student A guesses.
