Look at the Picture

Where is...? Where are...? Is there a...? Are there any...?

There are six desks in the classroom. There are three books on the teacher's desk. The cupboard is next to the board. There is a clock above the board. There is a computer on the table under the window. There is a pencil case on the blonde girl's desk. There is a rubber and a pencil on the red-haired boy's desk. There is a pair of scissors and two pencils on the brown-haired girl's desk. There is a ruler on the blond boy's desk. There is one pen on every desk.

What colour is the...?

The desks are red / brown. The cupboard is blue / green. The clock is black / white. Two books on the teacher's desk are orange / yellow. One book on the teacher's desk is green / purple. The computer is grey / white. The pencil case is pink / green. The pencils are yellow / blue. The ruler is purple / orange. The pens are black / blue. The scissors are red / pink.

Yes-No Questions

A: Are there any desks?

B: Yes, there are. / No, there aren't.

A: Can you see any books?

B: Yes, I can. / No, I can't.

A: Is there a computer?

B: Yes, there is. / No, there isn't.

A: Are there any pens?

B: Yes, there are. / No, there aren't.

2 Student B has to ask yes-no questions to guess what it is (for example: *Is it next to the window? Is it on a desk?*).
